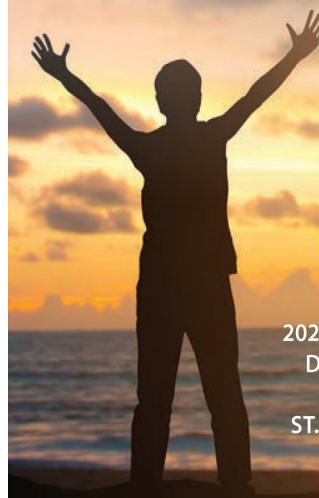

Son, our Lord Jesus Christ.

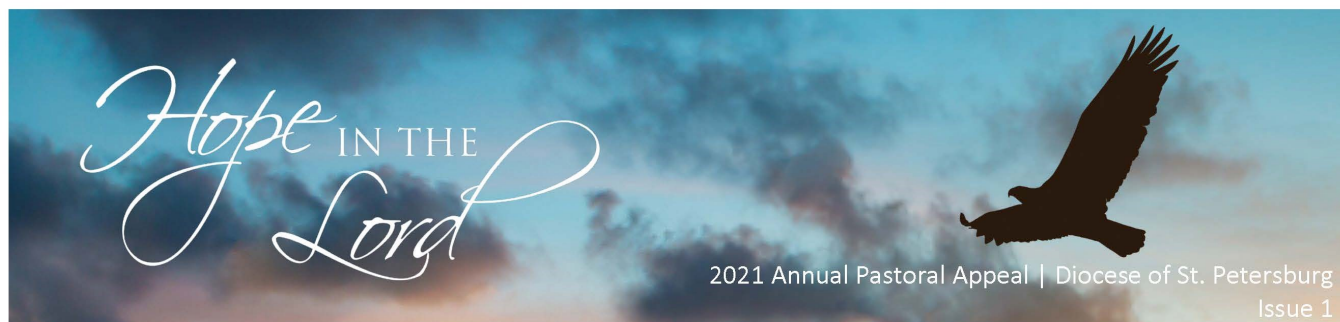

Tax Free Charitable Distribution from your IRA Account at age 70½!

Congress has permanently enacted qualified charitable distributions from your traditional IRA accounts. These distributions can be used to satisfy all or a portion of your Required Minimum Distribution. These distributions are free of federal and state income tax. Additionally, these gifts help you avoid the Medicare high income surcharge and can help to reduce taxes on your social security benefits. Distributions must be made directly from your IRA account to Sacred Heart Catholic Church.



Your bank will allow you to set up an automatic check issued from the bank to a business or organization. You will need to enter our name and mailing address: Sacred Heart Catholic Church, 32145 Saint Joe Road, Dade City, FL 33525. Although you do not have an "Account" number, you may put your envelope number in its place. Also, for each individual payment there is an option to add a note to the "Memo" line to specify if the check is for Offertory or another special collection such as Debt Reduction, Building Fund or Catholic Education.



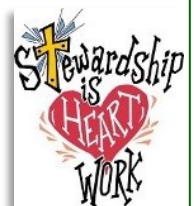

Fr. Tom Madden, Pastor of St. Mary, Our Lady of Sorrows Parish in Masaryktown will be offering a free three-part series on Loss and Grief. The sessions will be offered virtually via Zoom and cover:
